

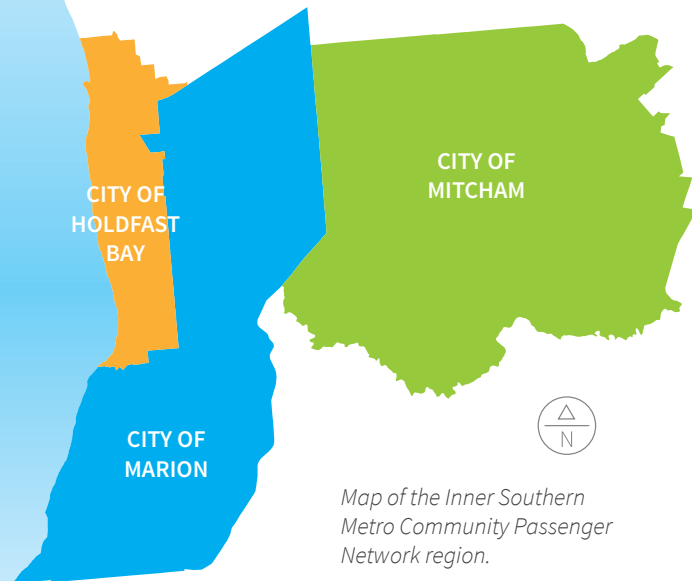
About Us

The Inner Southern Metro Community Passenger Network (CPN) is jointly funded through Commonwealth and State grants and delivered by the City of Marion.

Our aim is to support your independence by assisting with your transport needs.

We provide a community transport coordinated service for people who are frail or elderly, people with disabilities and the transport disadvantaged, across the inner southern metro region; Cities of Marion, Holdfast Bay and Mitcham.

The CPN works closely with our partnering council (City of Marion) and neighbouring councils to assist residents to reach their destination in the most efficient and cost effective manner.

Inner Southern Metro Community Passenger Network

Who is eligible?

People living in the inner southern metro region who are:

- 65 years or older
- 50 years or older of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) heritage
- Under 65 or under 50 years identifying as ATSI living with disability
- Transport disadvantaged
- Carers of the people above

In terms of the CPN, transport disadvantaged is defined as someone who is unable to access public transport due to distance, mobility and/or availability of services, unable to drive and unable to access another person to transport them.

Assessment

Eligibility for new clients requiring transport will be determined by an assessment conducted as follows:

- People aged 65 years and over and people 50 years and over of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage can contact My Aged Care to register and have their eligibility assessed.
- To ensure you receive the services of the Inner Southern Metro CPN you will need to request our services by advising the contact centre or your assessor.

Using the Service

If you need transport assistance to attend a medical appointment, social activity, shopping, family or community event, either within or outside the region boundaries, the Inner Southern Metro CPN may be able to assist you getting there.

At least *two* full business days notice for your transport request is required, call during office hours (Monday – Friday 8.30am – 5pm).

After hours and *weekend* transport requests can be supported. *Conditions apply.*

Fees

A client contribution fee is incurred for all services provided as recommended by the program funding body. This structure will be discussed with you during your initial registration. *No eligible person will be denied access to service due to their inability to pay.*
